REGISTERING TO VOTE

Who may register to vote in Virginia? Voters must be at least 18 years of age, a legal U.S. citizen whose permanent legal residence is in Virginia and who has not lost the right to vote due a felony conviction or being adjudicated mentally incompetent.

When may I register? Voters may register or update their registration at any time except during the 21 days before a general or primary election or the 14 days before a special election.

Do I need special information to register? You must furnish, under oath, your full legal name, home address, date of birth, social security number, and any previous place of registration.

Do I have to register by political party affiliation? No. The Commonwealth of Virginia does not register voters by party.

STAYING ELIGIBLE TO VOTE:

Do I have to register for each election? No. As long as you do not move, you are qualified for Federal, State, and local elections, including primary and special elections.

How do I change my address or name on my voter registration? Voters must submit a signed voter registration application to update their voter registration record. You may also submit a change online at <http://elections.virginia.gov> or visit any of the places listed above. Changes to your name or address through the Post Office or other County office DOES NOT change your voter registration.

VOTING ON ELECTION DAY

Where will I vote? Your polling location is based on your residence address. You will receive a letter once your registration has been processed listing your respective districts, precinct and polling location. This information can also be checked online at <https://elections.virginia.gov>.

When are the polls open? The polls open at 6:00 am and close at 7:00 pm. Any voter in line by 7:00 pm may still vote.

What type of identification must I present to vote? The Commonwealth of Virginia requires voters to present a valid identification such as a Virginia issued driver's license, passport, military id, employer id, etc. A list of all types of identification accepted can be found at <https://elections.virginia.gov>

When do general elections take place? General elections are held on the Tuesday following the first Monday in November. Town of Buchanan, Town of Fincastle and Town of Troutville elections are also held at the same time as General Elections.

What is a party primary? The Democratic and Republican parties may nominate their candidates by either a primary election or by convention. If the party asks for a primary election for the November election, it will be held on the second Tuesday in June. Should both parties hold primaries simultaneously in the same district, voters must designate which primary they wish to participate in when checking into the polling location as they are only allowed to participate in one primary per the *Code of Virginia*. (§24.2-530)

Can anyone vote in a primary election? Virginia does not register voters by party so registered voters can vote in either party primary. However, if a primary is held for both parties on the same day in the same election district, voters must designate which party primary to participate in when they check into their polling location as voters are only allowed to participate in one primary per the *Code of Virginia* §24.2-530.

What if I move after the books close for an election? You may be eligible to return to your old precinct and vote. You must change your address or name at that time to be eligible for future elections. If you move out of the Commonwealth, you will not be allowed to vote except in Federal elections for President and Vice President only.

NO EXCUSE ABSENTEE / EARLY VOTING

No Excuse Absentee Voting or Early Voting begins at least 45-days prior to every election. Applications to receive a Vote By Mail ballot can be submitted up to one-year prior to any election.

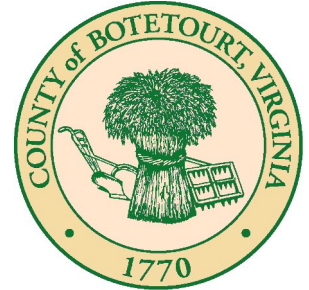
Who may vote early? Any qualified, registered voter in Botetourt County can vote early either in –person or by mail.

How do I apply for a Vote By Mail ballot? Voters may request an application for a Vote By Mail ballot by phone, in writing or complete one on-line at <https://elections.virginia.gov>. Applications can cover a specific election or can be marked as an annual request which will cover all elections throughout the year. Voters wishing to receive primary ballots must also indicate which party ballot they wish to receive.

Voters may vote early in person in the Department of Elections & Voter Registration Office located at 2 East Main Street, Fincastle during regular business hours during the early voting period.

When can I apply for a Vote By Mail ballot? Applications for Vote By Mail ballots may be submitted up to one year in advance of an election. If requesting a Vote By Mail ballot to be mailed, the application must be received no later than the 10 days prior to the election but voters are warned to take into consideration the potential delivery time for the postal service and request as early as possible. In-Person early voting begins at least 45 days before the election and continues during regular office hours through the Saturday before the election. Saturday hours are available the two Saturdays prior to all elections.

What is the deadline to vote early? The Saturday before any election is the deadline for in-person early voting. Mailed and/or hand delivered mark absentee ballots must be received by 7:00 pm on Election Day in the Department of Elections & Voter Registration Office. Special circumstances can constitute an emergency absentee ballot be issued but the Code of Virginia is very specific on those stipulations. Voters should contact our office with any questions regarding these stipulations.
